Venues



Central Lutheran

Central Lutheran is grounded in the call to explore the promise of God for all. The community seeks to live this call by welcoming all, no exception. Established over a century ago, the congregation continues to benefit from a firm foundation that persists today, both physically in the form of the stunning, century-old sanctuary and spiritually in the form of the church members' generosity and commitment to tend to the needs of the marginalized and advocate for change. Central Lutheran's Free Store, Restoration Center, and Street Voices for Change are just a few of the programs through which the congregation engages with and cares for the community. With faith formation ministries for children, youth, and adults, and a robust program of worship and music, Central Lutheran has been and will continue to be a steady, warm presence in its community, where all are welcome, no exceptions.

Parking | Central Lutheran has a paid parking lot and ramp located on the south side of the church facility. The parking lot is accessible via 3rd Avenue South (not the parking ramp entrance, but the surface lot entrance), from 4th Avenue South, and at the intersection of 15th Street and 4th Avenue South. A map with the entrance marked is available on the church website: centralmpls.org. After entering the surface lot, the ramp entrance is by the 4th Avenue South entrance. Designated handicapped parking spaces are available in both the ramp and lot for a nominal fee.

Entry and Elevator | Central Lutheran is accessible from the south entrance near the parking lot. A drop-off area and ramped entrance are located on the north side of 12th Street and enter directly into the Great Room. An elevator is located inside on the main level off the Great Room near the kitchen.

Wheelchair-Accessible Spaces | Central is wheelchair accessible. There is designated seating for wheelchairs and those with limited mobility in the sanctuary.

Restrooms | Wheelchair-accessible restrooms are located off the south entrance hallway near the Welcome Desk.

Service of Holy Eucharist | To receive Holy Communion in your aisle, please ask an usher when you arrive.

Speakers



Jay Augustine Professor, Pastor, Author, and Advocate

Jonathan C. Augustine (aka "Jay Augustine") is a pastor and professor, as well as an author and advocate. He is part of a group of national social justice leaders who

speak for the equality of all human beings while advocating for policies of diversity, inclusion, and belonging. Since May 2019, he has served as the senior pastor of St. Joseph AME Church (Durham, NC), while simultaneously serving, since January 2017, as the general chaplain of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.



Timothy Adkins-Jones Assistant Professor of Homiletics, Union Theological Seminary

The Rev. Timothy Levi Adkins-Jones is the Pastor of the historic Bethany Baptist Church in Newark, New Jersey. A son of the church, Rev. Adkins-Jones was led to faith

in Christ by his grandfather the Rev. Leroy Jones at Pilgrim Journey Baptist Church in his hometown of Richmond, Virginia. Before being called to Bethany, Rev. Adkins-Jones faithfully led congregations in Massachusetts and Connecticut, building a young legacy of community activism and Christian service. He gladly serves as part of the leadership team for the New Jersey Black Multi-Faith Alliance and the Clergy Caucus for Faith in New Jersey, a nonpartisan, multi-faith organization seeking social and economic change through policy and relationships.



Rosemary Bray McNatt

President of Starr King School for the Ministry, Professor of Unitarian Universalist Ministry and Heritage

The Rev. Rosemary Bray McNatt became President of Starr King School for the Ministry in Oakland, CA in 2014. For 13 years, she was

Senior Minister of The Fourth Universalist Society in the City of New York, a 175-year-old Unitarian Universalist congregation on the Upper West Side of Manhattan. Born and raised in Chicago, Illinois, she is a graduate of Yale University and Drew Theological Seminary.

She has taught Unitarian Universalist history and polity since 2005 at Union Theological Seminary in New York City and Yale Divinity School in New Haven, CT. She also served as a faculty member of the 2008 International Council of Unitarian Universalists Leadership Training Conference in Nairobi, Kenya the first ever such gathering on the African Continent.



Anna Carter Florence Peter Marshall Professor of Preaching, Columbia Theological Seminary

Anna Carter Florence is the Peter Marshall Professor of Preaching at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. She is an

ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and holds degrees from Yale University and Princeton Theological Seminary (M.Div. and Ph.D.). Before joining the Columbia faculty in 1998, Dr. Florence served as an associate pastor for youth and young adults at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Minneapolis. Her books include Preaching as Testimony, Inscribing the Word, and Rehearsing Scripture: Discovering God's Word in Community (Eerdmans, 2018), based on her 2012 Lyman Beecher Lectures on Preaching at Yale Divinity School; her current book project is 'A' is for Alabaster: A Preacher's Alphabet. She has also published numerous articles and chapters in books and journals, including a year's worth of lectionary text commentaries for WorkingPreacher.org.



Emeric was the first Latino to be ordained as an elder in the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church and was the founding pastor of Cristo Vive UMC in Durham, NC. He became the founding director of the Hispanic House of Studies at Duke Divinity School in 2007 and joined the Divinity School faculty in 2008. From 2010-2021, he served as the director of the Central American Methodist Course of Study, which trains Methodist pastors who have not earned a formal master of divinity degree in such places as El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Panama. He is also the director of the Duke-Peru Theological Initiative, a partnership between the Methodist Church of Peru and Duke Divinity School.



Samuel Cruz

Associate Professor of Church and Society, Union Theological Seminary

Associate Professor of Church and Society Samuel Cruz completed his Ph.D. at Drew University, Madison, N.J. in 2002 under the directorship of internationally renowned

philosopher and sociologist of religion, Dr. Otto Maduro. Cruz also completed his M.Phil. from Drew University in 1999. He received the M.A., Magna Cum Laude, from New Brunswick Theological Seminary in New Brunswick, NJ. In addition, is a 1987 graduate of the College of New Rochelle in New Rochelle, NY. Cruz's publications include two books, "Masked Africanisms: Puerto Rican Pentecostalism" (Kendall Hunt Publishing, 2005), as well as "Christianity and Culture in the City: A Post-Colonial Approach" (Lexington Books, 2013). He is currently working on a book project "Latinas and the LGBT Community: Implications for the Church and Beyond."



Michael Curry

27th and Current Presiding Bishop and Primate of The Episcopal Church

The Most Rev. Michael Bruce Curry is the presiding bishop and primate of The Episcopal Church. At the church's 78th General Convention in

June 2015, he was elected to a nine-year term in this role and installed in November of that year; he serves as The Episcopal Church's chief pastor, spokesperson, and president and chief executive officer.

Throughout his ministry, Bishop Curry has been

a prophetic leader, particularly in the areas of racial reconciliation, climate change, evangelism, immigration policy, and marriage equality. The animating vision and message of his ministry are Jesus of Nazareth and his way of radical, sacrificial love, and he regularly reminds Episcopalians they are "the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement."



Yvette Flunder

Founder and Senior Pastor, City of Refuge UCC; Presiding Bishop, the Fellowship of Affirming Ministries

Yvette A. Flunder is an advocate for justice and the founder and senior pastor of the City of Refuge United Church of Christ. She is a graduate

of the Certificate of Ministry Studies and Master of Arts programs at the Pacific School of Religion, and she received her Doctor of Ministry degree from San Francisco Theological Seminary. Since 2003, Flunder has served as presiding bishop of the Fellowship of Affirming Ministries, a multidenominational coalition of over 100 primarily African American Christian leaders and laity representing churches and faithbased organizations from the United States, Mexico, three countries in Africa, and Asia. TFAM is in a covenantal relationship with the United Church of Christ, the Metropolitan Community Church, and the Centers for Spiritual Living.



Cynthia Hale

Founding & Senior Pastor; Ray of Hope Christian Church, Decatur, Georgia

Cynthia Hale is the founding and senior pastor of Ray of Hope Christian Church in Decatur, Georgia. She earned a Master of

Divinity from Duke University and earned a Doctor of Ministry from United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio. Hale established a mentoring program, Elah Pastoral Ministries, Inc, and convenes a Women in Ministry Conference each year. Hale was inducted into the African American Biographies Hall of Fame and the Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers of Morehouse College. Hale has published "I'm A Piece of Work: Sisters Shaped by God" and has been a contributing writer to many publications including, Feasting on the Gospels. Hale has received the "Women of Power" award from the National Urban League and earned recognition from Ebony magazine as an influential leader.



Dawn Hand Central Maryland District Superintendent; Baltimore-Washington Conference

The Rev. Dawn M. Hand is an ordained elder of the Western North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church and Central

Maryland District Superintendent for the Baltimore-Washington Conference - The United Methodist Church.

In 2011, Hand was appointed to Foundry United Methodist Church in Washington, D.C., and served as its Executive Pastor and Chief of Staff. In this role, she was responsible for managing the dayto-day operations of a historic downtown church with a congregation of more than 1,200 members. Before being appointed to Foundry, Rev. Hand was an Associate Pastor at Matthews United Methodist Church in Matthews, NC. Luke Powery

Dean of Duke University Chapel & Associate Professor of Homiletics at **Duke Divinity School**

Luke Powery is the dean of Duke University Chapel and associate professor of homiletics at Duke Divinity School. He was previously

an assistant professor of homiletics at Princeton Theological Seminary. He received a B.A. in music from Stanford University, a Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary, and a Doctor of Theology from Emmanuel College at the University of Toronto. Powery is the author of several books, including "Rise Up, Shepherd! Advent Reflections on the Spirituals" (Westminster John Knox, 2017) and "Ways of the Word: Learning to Preach for Your Time and Place" (Fortress, 2016). He was ordained by the Progressive National Baptist Convention and served as secretary of the Academy of Homiletics. The African-American Pulpit named him one of 20 outstanding black ministers under the age of 40 who are shaping the future of the church, and he was inducted into the Martin Luther King Jr. Collegium of Scholars at Morehouse College for his leadership in the academy, church, and broader society. His work focuses on preaching, culture, and the African diaspora.



Melva Sampson

Assistant Professor of Preaching and Practical Theology, Wake Forest University School of Divinity

Melva Sampson is an assistant professor of preaching and practical theology at Wake Forest University School of Divinity. She

earned a Ph.D. at Emory University in Atlanta, a Master of Divinity from Candler School of Theology at Emory University, and a Master of Arts in Human Communication Studies at Howard University in Washington, D.C. Sampson has served in ministry roles at the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta and First Afrikan Church in Lithonia, Georgia. She is an ordained minister

of the Progressive National Baptist Convention and an ordained ruling elder in the Presbyterian Church, USA. Sampson is the creator and curator of Pink Robe Chronicles and Raising Womanish Girls, digital platforms used to illuminate the role of sacred memory and ritual in the collective healing of marginalized communities.



Matthew L. Skinner

Professor of New Testament, Luther Seminary; Scholar for Adult Education, Westminster Presbyterian Church

Matthew L. Skinner, one of the co-hosts of the popular Sermon Brainwave podcast, has served on

the Luther Seminary faculty since 2002. He teaches courses there in the master's degree programs and the doctor of ministry in biblical preaching program. His research and teaching focus on the Gospels, Acts, the cultural dynamics on display in those writings, and the ways the Bible continues to shape Christian identity among its readers and hearers. His most recent publications include Acts: Catching up with the Spirit (2020), the three-volume work A Companion to the New Testament (2017-2018), and Intrusive God, Disruptive Gospel: Encountering the Divine in the Book of Acts (2015). An ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA), Skinner has contributed to numerous print and digital resources to help preachers with biblical interpretation. He also serves in a local Minneapolis Presbyterian congregation seeking to develop new directions and offerings for educational ministries both within and beyond the walls of the church. He teaches frequently at workshops and conferences for church leaders.



William Willimon

Professor of the Practice of Christian Ministry, Duke Divinity School

For 20 years, William H. Willimon was dean of the chapel and professor of Christian ministry at Duke University. He served as pastor of churches in Georgia and

South Carolina. A graduate of Wofford College, Willimon holds a Master of Divinity from Yale Divinity School and a Doctor of Sacred Theology from Emory University. He has been awarded honorary degrees from a dozen colleges and universities. In 1992, he was named the first distinguished alumnus of Yale Divinity School. He is the author of 60 books. His

"Worship as Pastoral Care" was selected as one of the 10 most useful books for pastors in 1979 by the Academy of Parish Clergy.



Tripp Fuller

Tripp Fuller just moved back to North Carolina after three years as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow in Theology & Science at the University of Edinburgh. He recently released Divine Self-Investment: a Constructive Open and Relational

Christology, the first book in the Studies in Open and Relational Theology series. For over 15 years Tripp has been doing the Homebrewed Christianity podcast (think on-demand internet radio) where he interviews different scholars about their work so you can get nerdy in traffic, on the treadmill, or doing the dishes. Last year it had over 4 million downloads. It also inspired a book series with Fortress Press called the Homebrewed Christianity Guides to... topics like God, Jesus, Spirit, Church History, etc. Tripp is a very committed and (some of his friends think overly) engaged Lakers fan and takes Star Wars and Lord of the Rings very seriously.

He is the author of "The Journey and Promise of African American Preaching," "A Pursued Justice: Black Preaching from the Great Migration to Civil Rights," "Exodus Preaching: Crafting Sermons about Justice and Hope," and is a columnist for Living the Word in Sojourners magazine. Gilbert is an ordained Baptist minister, founder of The Preaching Project, and the recipient of Louisville Institute's First Book Grant for Minority Scholars and Howard University's Emerging Scholar Award and Andrew Mellon Fellowship.



James C. Howell

Senior Pastor of Myers Park United Methodist Church, Charlotte, N.C.; Adjunct Professor of Preaching, **Duke Divinity School**

Howell has been the Senior Pastor of Myers Park United Methodist Church since 2003. He studied

chemistry and physics at the University of South Carolina before going to Divinity School at Duke, where he also earned a Ph.D. in Old Testament. He has published 17 books, including Yours are the Hands of Christ, Worshipful, and Weak Enough to Lead. He is involved in leadership within the denomination and city-wide endeavors. Biking, hiking, and reading fill his spare time. He and his wife Lisa, a photographer and community activist, have 3 grown children.



Bill McKibben
Author and Environmentalist

Bill McKibben is a contributing writer to The New Yorker, and a founder of Third Act, which organizes people over the age of 60 to work on climate and racial justice. He founded the first global

grassroots climate campaign, 350.org, and serves as the Schumann Distinguished Professor in Residence at Middlebury College in Vermont. In 2014, he was awarded the Right Livelihood Prize, sometimes called the "alternative Nobel," in the Swedish Parliament. He's also won the Gandhi Peace Award and honorary degrees from 19 colleges and universities. He has written over a dozen books about the environment, including his first, The End of Nature, published in 1989, and his latest book is The Flag, the Cross, and the Station Wagon: A Graying American Looks Back at His Suburban Boyhood and Wonders What the Hell Happened.



Angela D. Sims

President, Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School

The Rev. Angela D. Sims, Ph.D., is the first woman president of Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School (CRCDS). Before joining CRCDS

on July 1, 2019, Dr. Sims served as Vice President of Institutional Advancement and Robert B. and Kathleen Rogers Professor in Church and Society at Saint Paul School of Theology in Leawood, Kansas. She holds a Ph.D. in Christian Social Ethics from Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, Virginia. Before matriculation at Union, Dr. Sims completed a baccalaureate degree summa cum laude at Trinity College (Trinity Washington University) and a Master of Divinity with honors at Howard University School of Divinity.

Kimberly Wagner previously served as an assistant professor of homiletics in the Axel Jacob and Gerda Maria (Swanson) Carlson Chair in Homiletics at

She is passionate about supporting students' formation and helping clergy and communities navigate the realities of an ever-changing world and church. Her current writing and work focus on preaching and ministry in the midst and wake of trauma, particularly thinking about collective trauma, the role of the preacher, and the resources of Scriptures and faith to respond to these moments.

Fred B. Craddock Professor
Emeritus, Phillips Seminary

Richard F. Ward received his B.A. from Oklahoma Baptist University, his M.F.A. from Trinity University, a M.A.R. from Christian Theological Seminary, and a Ph.D. from

Northwestern University. Ward brings to the study of preaching a rich background in performance studies and practices. He is particularly interested in the arts of storytelling and oral interpretation of Scripture as they inform and enrich the ministry of preaching. Ward is the author of "Speaking from the Heart: Preaching with Passion" and has several contributions and articles for the disciplines of homiletics, performance theory, and communication studies. A second book, "Speaking of the Holy: The Communicative Art of Preaching," was published in May 2002. He is also the co-editor of "Craddock Stories" with Mike Graves and Fred Craddock. Most recently, with David Trobisch, Ward co-authored "Bringing the Word to Life: Exploring the New Testament through Performing It" (Eerdmans, 2013). Ward served on the editorial boards for "Feasting on the Word: A Lectionary Commentary Series" and "Feasting on the Gospels" for Westminster John Knox Press. Ordained in the United Church of Christ, Ward previously served on the faculties of the Iliff School of Theology, Yale Divinity School, and the Candler School of Theology at Emory University. Since retiring from full-time teaching Dr. Ward has been a consultant for the Excellence in Preaching program at Perkins School of Theology and as interim pastor for UCC churches in the Denver area.



Sam Wells Vicar, St. Martin-in-the-Fields, London; Visiting Professor of Christian Ethics, King's College

The Rev. Dr. Sam Wells has been Vicar of St. Martin-in-the-Fields since 2012. He has served as a parish priest for 23 years - 10 of

those in areas of urban deprivation. He also spent 7 years in North Carolina, where he was Dean of Duke University Chapel.

Sam is also Visiting Professor of Christian Ethics at King's College. He is a regular contributor to Thought for the Day on BBC Radio 4's Today program. He has published 40 books, including works on Christian ethics, mission, ministry, scripture, liturgy, and preaching. Sam is married to Jo Wells, who is the Bishop of Dorking. They have two adult children.




Lucy Winkett Rector of St James's Piccadilly, London

The Rev. Lucy Winkett is a broadcaster, writer, and Rector of St James's Piccadilly, London. With degrees in History and Theology from Cambridge and Birmingham,

she also trained as a soprano at the Royal College of Music. She worked as a professional singer before ordination and also spent time living in a L'Arche Community with people with learning disabilities.

One of the first generation of women to be ordained priests in the Church of England, she began her ministry in Newham, East London, before becoming the first woman priest appointed at St. Paul's Cathedral in its 1,400-year history. This appointment was controversial, attracting national and international interest, as the Church of England grappled with the ordination of women for the first time. She became Canon Precentor with particular responsibility for the music and liturgy of the cathedral, being responsible for, amongst other things, HM The Queen's Golden Jubilee service of thanksgiving, the national services for the end of UK deployment in Iraq, Afghanistan, and the commemoration services after 9/11 and the South Asian tsunami of 2004.




The Fleshpots of Egypt

History of the Festival

The Festival of Homiletics began in 1992 with a gathering of 400 pastors from around the country to learn and converse about preaching in a contemporary context. David Howell, an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA), created the Festival as an extension of his preaching journal, Lectionary Homiletics, and the Festival's ownership, leadership, and planning efforts have resided with Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota, since 2012.

A week-long conference designed to inspire discourse and theological reflection upon the practices of preaching and worship, particularly as churches navigate the 21st century and ever-changing society, the Festival aims to inspire preachers in their roles, renew their faith, and refresh their spirits.

Each year we invite approximately 25 outstanding preachers and professors of homiletics from diverse backgrounds, traditions, and ministry settings to engage the complexities of today's culture through the lens of God's grace, God's church, and God's Word. Speakers over the years have included William Barber II, Nadia Bolz-Weber, Walter Brueggemann, Barbara Brown Taylor, Diana Butler Bass, Anna

Carter Florence, Michael Curry, Yvette Flunder, Otis Moss III, Luke Powery, Will Willimon, and Andrew Young.
